THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Staff Reports

A. Field Inspection Report

The Board received a Field Inspection update from Mr. Patrick Bell. During the update it was determined that the Jasmine on the pool fence was not to be cut down and that Greg Woodcock would work with Patrick to get him a proper map that he and LMP could use to mark where sod needed to be replaced. On the subject of LMP being put in warning status, Mr. Bell indicated that he was pleased with the progress LMP was making. Ms. Murray inquired about the sidewalk and rutting issue at the front entrance and was informed by Mr. Raines, with LMP, that it was in progress.

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of the Minutes of the Board of Supervisors' Regular Meeting held on August 8, 2019

Mr. Cox presented the August 8, 2019 Board of Supervisor meeting minutes which had been amended by the Chairman prior to the meeting.

On a Motion by Ms. Macsuga, seconded by Ms. Murray, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors approved the August 8, 2019 minutes of the Board of Supervisors' regular meeting, as amended, for the Panther Trails Community Development District.

FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of the Operation & Maintenance Expenditures for July & August 2019

Mr. Cox presented the Operation and Maintenance expenditures for July & August 2019 for Board ratification.

On a Motion by Ms. Nelson, seconded by Ms. Murray, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors approved to ratify the payment of the invoices in the July 2019 Operations & Maintenance Expenditures report (\$48,433.95) and August 2019 Operations & Maintenance Expenditures report (\$49,369.45), for the Panther Trails Community Development District.

The Board requested staff to look into a less expensive type of access card and to see if there was a way to determine how revenues from the cards matched up with the expenses.

Mr. Cox explained that he had requested a reimbursement from Andrews Aquatics for the pool maintenance work that did not achieve success.

SIXTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Discussion of Fences on CDD Property

The Board discussed the status of the fences that were to be removed from CDD property at several locations throughout the Community. Mr. Cox informed the Board that he had information that one resident had moved the fence and another demonstrated that the fence was within his property line. He also noted that he had extended the time to remove to one of the residents.

SEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Discussion of Brazilian Pepper Tree Removal

 The Board reviewed two proposals to remove Brazilian Pepper trees from locations in Phase I of the community and tabled the topic to a time to be determined later.

EIGHTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Discussion of Pool Status

The Board received an update of the pool repair status from Mr. Cox and Mr. Woodcock. Ms. Macsuga requested information regarding what was wrong with the pool, what was done by A and D to fix the condition and when the pool would be ready to swim in so she could get this information out to the community. Mr. Woodcock explain his opinion of the "cracks" in the bottom and suggested that any additional examination of the cracks be postponed until A and D Pool Service can get the pool in operation once again and can monitor and possibly make fixes to the cracks.

NINTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Insurance Proposal

On a Motion by Ms. Murray, seconded by Ms. Macsuga, with all in favor, the Board of Supervisors approved the EGIS insurance proposal for FY 19-20, for the Panther Trails Community Development District.

TENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Staff Reports (Continued)

A. Monthly Aquatic Report

The Board reviewed the monthly pond maintenance report from Aquatic Systems.

The Board reviewed the pond assessment report from Aquatic Systems for pond #4. After discussing the recommendation of installing an aeration system, the

Board directed staff to have Aquatic Systems prepare a proposal for aquatic plantings and to try to remedy the algae issue with the plants and treatments before any additional consideration for aeration devices would be given.

B. District Counsel

Not present.

C. District Engineer

Mr. Woodcock provided an update to the Board. He explained that the from his inspection of pond #14, he could find not source of the reported oder other than directly from the pig farm located in the vicinity of the pond. Mr. Woodcock also explained that the last report of water usage as it relates to the water use permit was within tolerance and that if the next report was the same, the violation from SWFWMD would be resolved. However, it was noted that the grass and plants seemed to be suffering from the reduced level of irrigation and that an amendment of the water use permit might be required. Mr. Woodcock indicated he would do additional research into how the current water use permit was issued and at what levels.

D. Clubhouse Manager

The Board received a Clubhouse report from Will Williams. The Board requested that staff have the Symmes Road fencing pressure washed.

E. District Manager

Mr. Cox reminded the Board that the next meeting was scheduled for October 10, 2019 at 5:30 p.m., but it was not determined yet if this meeting would be canceled or not.

Mr. Cox reviewed the action item list and provided a financial update to the Board.

Mr. Cox explained that it was highly probable that a budget amendment would be required after the end of the fiscal year in order to adjust the budget to meet the current expenditure levels.





General Updates, Recent & Upcoming Maintenance Events

- ☐ Treat all active fire ant mounds throughout the property. Once mound is dead, mound must be raked out to expose turf.
- ☐ As a reminder, all Spanish Moss must be removed from all CDD-maintained trees during the dormant months (per contract). This will include all Crepe Myrtles and other smaller trees in their entirety if tree is 15' or below. This must be done prior to the spring flush on deciduous trees.

The following are action items for Duval Landscape to complete. Please refer to the item # in your response listing action already taken or anticipated time of completion. Red text indicates deficient from previous report. Bold Red text indicates deficient for more than a month. Green text indicates a proposal has been requested. Blue indicates irrigation.

- Make sure that all the sidewalks are edged and the curbs.
- 2. There were a couple broken sprinkle heads, so we need a wet check.
- 3. Treat the weeds in the Cul-de-sac at Tar Hollow Dr.
- 4. The Viburnum hedge across the front of the community along Symmes Rd needs to be treated for fungus. (photo 4)
- 5. There is an irrigation issue at the second entrance.
- 6. Lift the trees along the front of the community off the white fence.
- 7. Remove the sucker growth off the Crepe Myrtles in the front of the community.
- 8. The Magnolia trees in the front of the community need to be removed. (photo 8)
- 9. Remove the vines growing on the white fence across the front of the community.







Ekker Road North, Clubhouse

- 10. Continue to lightly prune the Crepe Myrtles so the limbs are not bending over to touch the ground.
- 11. There is a Brazilin Pepper growing in the Cardboard Palm at the end of the white fence at the front of the community. (photo 11)
- 12. Remove any vines growing up on trees and fence lines. (pic 12)



- 13. Put an edge on the sidewalk across the front of the community.
- 14. Remove any sucker growth off the Oak trees in the right of way going down Ekker Rd.
- 15. Remind the crew to be careful and not over spray into the turf. (photo 15)
- 16. Treat the weeds in the pool deck weekly.
- 17. The plant material behind the pool is wilting because the pump was down.
- 18. Keep the Ligustrum on the northside of the club house punned. (photo 18)
